The supported HTML table elements

The HTML table element () is divided into rows (), and each row may contain a number of table data cells () or ().

The , , , and elements support two attributes: (i) align and (ii) valign.

(i) align

You use align to horizontally arrange items within a table cell. The possible values are as follows:

- "left" to left-align the content in a cell.
- "center" to center-align the content in a cell.
- "right" to right-align the content in a cell.
- "justify" to stretch the content with equal width.
- "char" to align the content to a specific character.

(ii) valign

You use valign to vertically arrange items within a table cell. The possible values are as follows:

- "top" to top-align the content in a cell.
- "middle" to center-align the content in a cell.
- "bottom" to bottom-align the content in a cell.

The table element shown in the figure below will be rendered in a DocBook format as in figure below.
