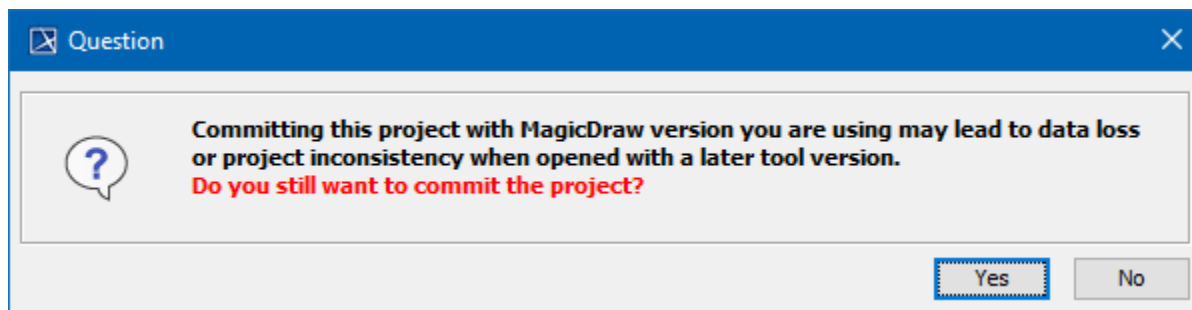


# Forward compatibility

The cross-version compatibility checking mechanism is triggered when a project with new feature usages is loaded with an older version of the modeling tool. The mechanism tracks feature usages of 19.0 SP3 and later service pack (SP) versions that result in the appearance of a **Missing features detected** notification in earlier modeling tool versions. The following table shows tracked features, the version they appear in, and whether the project can be committed/saved without any consequences.

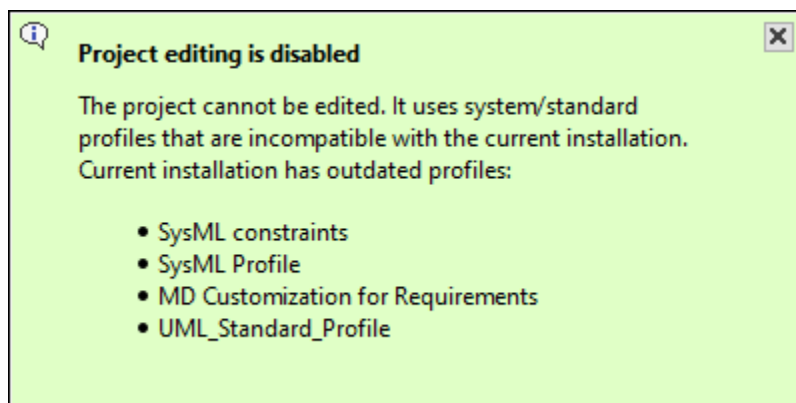
| Feature name                                                                       | Version  | Secure to commit/save |
|------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|----------|-----------------------|
| <a href="#">Contextual relationships in the dependency matrix</a>                  | 19.0 SP3 | Yes                   |
| <a href="#">Displaying classifiers on internal structure and behavior diagrams</a> | 19.0 SP3 | Yes                   |
| <a href="#">Custom hierarchy in tables</a>                                         | 19.0 SP3 | Yes                   |
| <a href="#">Lock-free Model Editing</a>                                            | 19.0 SP3 | No                    |

If you are working with features that can cause inconsistencies after save/commit (see the [table](#) above), the following warning message indicating possible consequences if you proceed will be shown.



## Compatibility of profiles

While the tool is backward compatible, we highly recommend for every user working on a particular project to use the same version of the tool. For example, if you use an older version of the tool and open a project created with a later version, a balloon notification pops up:



To avoid this:

- Make sure that every user working on the same project uses the same version of the tool.
- Do not migrate profiles unless every user working on the same project is informed and ready for migration.
